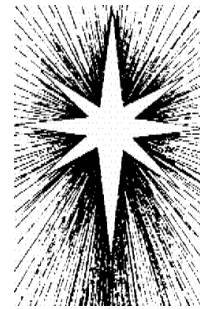

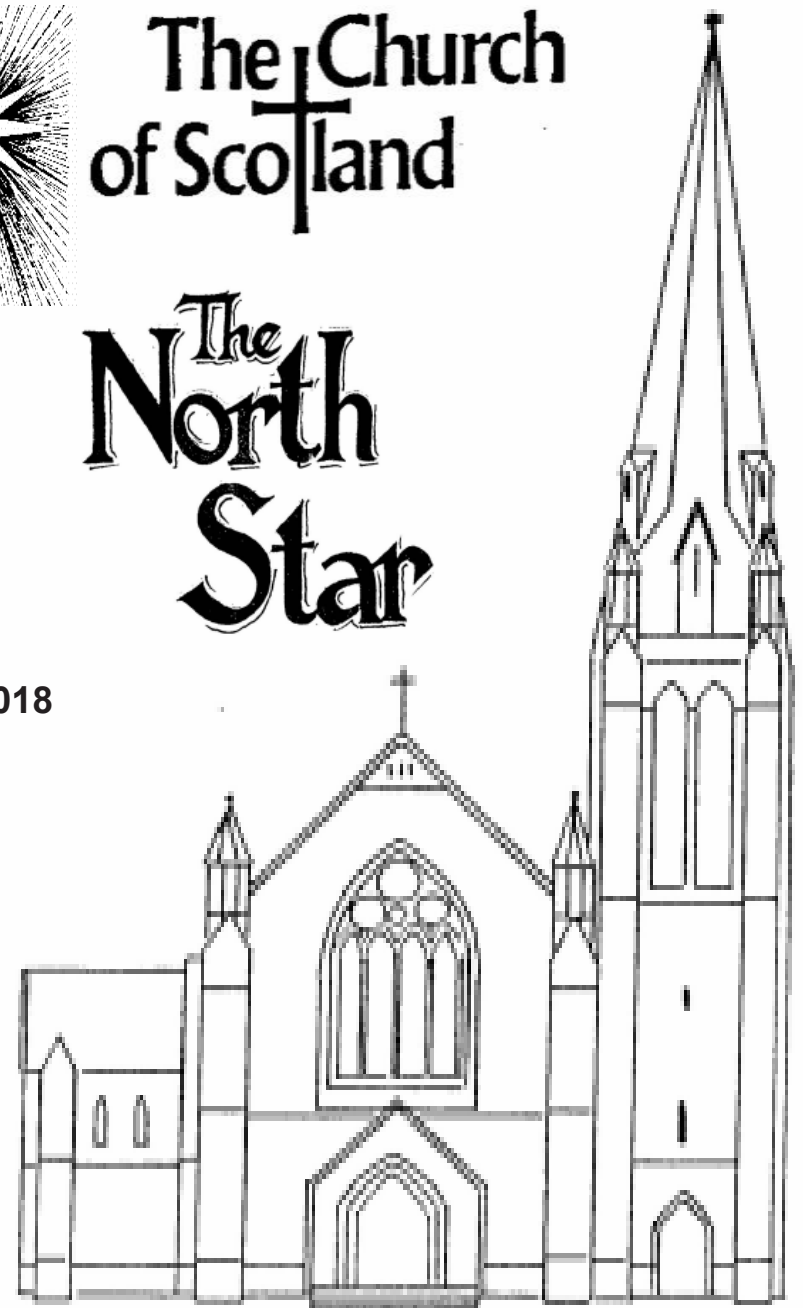

Greetings to you all.

You can buy it in a grocery store, a cafe, the mall, from a van and in a sweetie shop. It comes in red, pink, brown, white, white with black specks, green, green with black specks, orange, yellow and who knows how many other colours. It is very cold, but sometimes people put hot stuff on top of it. It will make you fat if you eat too much. It can give you a headache if you eat it too fast. It will hurt your teeth if you have any cavities. It can clog the arteries of the old and promote blemishes on the young. You can get it by the gallon, quart, pint or scoop. Some people use a cone to hold it, others put it on top of a banana, others melt it with milk and drink it through a straw.

What is it? Ice Cream of course. I scream, you scream, we all scream for ... well, you know the rest I'm sure. Now if you were asked, could you adequately describe the taste, texture and feelings that correspond to eating an ice cream cone on a hot summer day to someone who had never tasted it before? Perhaps some things are best left to experience, like God's grace.

In Romans 5:7–10 (ESV) Paul says: “For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die— but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life.”

Those verses describe God's grace revealing that it is God's unmerited favour and is distinct from mercy. Grace is getting what you don't deserve whereas mercy is not getting what you do deserve. We can sing about it, “Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound ...” However, unless you taste it, unless you experience it, you will find it rather bland. The truth is that when we experience grace it al-

ways leaves us wanting more.

Perhaps this prayer written by one minister will help us experience even more of its wonderful taste: “Help me Lord to look past my needs to see my sins. So I'll not be satisfied with the way things have been. Help me peel back my pride and admit I'm to blame. Let me know your forgiveness, release me from my shame and let me brush next to your glory and see your face. Fill me Lord, anoint me Lord, drench me with your grace. So I can fight the good fight, and run the good race. Continue to let me experience your blessings and pour them out in this place.”

The reality is that it is easy to become accustomed to God's grace to take it for granted. So as we head into the summer season let us each day take time to thank God for His grace in our lives. And as you contemplate the wonderful taste it brings, ask yourself: Is there someone to whom I need to show God's grace? If so, then think of a way that you can allow them to taste and experience that grace. In other words be God's grace in action.

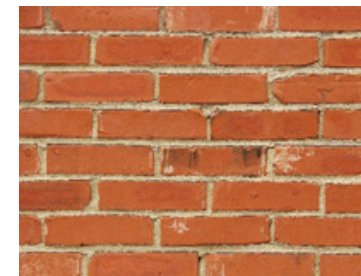

Prayer Topics May 2018

1. The Leprosy Mission - Thailand

The McKean Rehabilitation Centre is owned by the Thai church and has had a long relationship with TLM. It is recognized as the centre providing leprosy expertise in north Thailand and also provides residential treatment and rehabilitation for marginalised or displaced disabled persons along with training in activities to promote sustainable livelihoods. Pray for God's leading in all development plans and that all the frequent interactions with a wide spectrum of visitors and trainees will bring positive results and demonstrate God's love. One such development is a new training school for senior care givers, where many will have their first experience with the Christian message – pray for its impact in their lives.

2. Mission Aviation Fellowship – South Sudan

Pray that God will prepare the hearts of a Security Manager, Ground Operations Manager a Deputy Director of Maintenance and four pilots to join our team in South Sudan. The harvest season did little to ease the nation's ongoing food crisis, with 45% of the population remaining severely short of food. Pray for the nutrition and veterinary programmes run by Afro-Canadian Evangelical Mission, a frequent MAF flyer, as the organisation works to save both people and livestock..

3. Open Doors - Egypt

In January, two brothers were shot dead by a gunman as they assisted a Coptic Christian in his shop in Gaza and another Christian was killed in the town of Arish. He was shot by armed men on his way home – all because they noticed he had a small tattoo of a cross on his wrist. There has been an increase in violent attacks mostly initiated by so-called Islamic State, but also a lack of government protection means the rights of Christians are frequently overlooked. This makes it hard for Christians to receive education and find employment. But despite

the increasing pressure, many Christians are determined to live out their faith, even when it means risking their lives. Bishop Hosny, whose church was attacked shortly before New Year says, “We know we are still targeted, but we insist on going to our churches and celebrating our feasts. This is what must be done to confront terrorist threats.” “Lord Jesus please be with those who have lost loved ones in recent attacks and comfort them in their grief. Please provide for these Christians struggling to get education or employment and soften the hearts of the authorities that Christians' rights may be protected”.

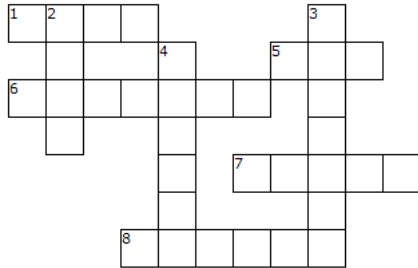
4 Again thinking of young people, pray for all children who are abused, neglected, orphaned or disabled, especially those who have never known the love of a caring parent or other grown up. Pray that God will bring into each young life someone with a great heart of love for children who will show them the love of their Heavenly Father.

Pray for our Worship Team as they reach out into the community with services in Boyle Court, Hillcrest and Trust Housing. Ask that these services may be meaningful and a blessing to residents and staff. Pray for those who lead. Give thanks for the Wednesday Break team and the time they spend in prayer and preparation. Pray that many more people will join us and be blessed by the messages and fellowship we enjoy so much each week. Remember Pastor Richard as he visits the sick and sorrowing and spends hours preparing for funeral services and comforting and encouraging bereaved families. Give thanks and pray for Margie in her supporting role. May God's blessing be on all that is done in our midst and may He receive all the glory.

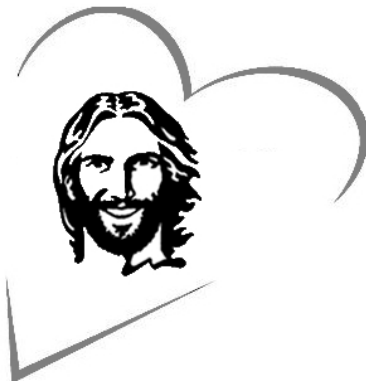
