



October Newsletter for Girvan North.

Dear friends, Luke is the longest Gospel with most parables, miracles and teachings within it. Half of the Lukan material is unique to his Gospel. Whilst Matthew arranges his material, Luke is less structured. Often the teaching occurs whilst food is eaten. Luke's Gospel takes us from Galilee to Jerusalem, (9-19). The first half of his Gospel is similar to Mark's. Luke discusses Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, His rejection by Jewish leadership, and the disciples' preparation for Ministry after Jesus leaves them. Just as in Matthew and Mark, Luke talks about the suffering Messiah, but in detail. Jesus dies a tragic death, but God has a purpose behind this horror, (Luke 23).

God has a plan to assist the poor, persecuted and sinful, (4:16-19). This plan fulfils the scriptural promise. This is a joyful Gospel written of its time and moves from location to location. Jesus is the Messiah, Lord, Son of God, a prophet like Moses, and suffering servant, rolled into one. These terms explain what Scripture adds to God's plan. Jesus starts a Kingdom which will defeat sin, (17:20-21). When Jesus returns He will complete His Kingdom to rule Israel, and beyond. The Jewish leaders rejected this message, but God's plan remains. Israel will suffer for its lack of faith, (19:41-44), and the nation destroyed as God's plan progresses. Israel can still redeem itself if it turns back to God.

Jesus creates "the way" - those accepting His message who seek forgiveness from sin, (5:32). Tax collectors and sinners respond willingly, whilst the Jewish leaders do not, (7:29). Women respond, (2:36-37). Jesus wants the message to reach the poor and the persecuted, (4:16-19). The disciples must continue their mission despite the rejection they will face, (21: 7-19). Jesus said you must love your enemies, trust God, pray, and ensure God's work continues. Persecution and materialism prevent discipleship.

Luke says Jesus' rejection does not nullify the Gospel. This rejection

was predicted. Luke reassures his readers of the Gospel's truth. Luke states Jesus fulfils His promises, forgives sins, and encourages others to follow Him. Jesus' ascension encourages the disciples to proclaim the Good News and eternal life. The Gospel does not name Luke, but Justin, Irenaeus, Tertullian and Clement do. Luke is an occasional disciple of Paul and comes from Antioch. From Colossians 4:10-14, Luke is a doctor and a non-Jew.

Those who believe an earlier dated Luke, cite Acts ending around 62. The Gospel must be written before this. Alternatively, if Luke describes Jerusalem's destruction, should it be after 70? But Jesus could have predicted this. Also, if time was needed for Paul's stance to rise, an 80s date is possible, although the evidence rejects this. Also, Acts points to an earlier Church emerging. There is little mention of the Roman population, no explicit 70 reference, and a racially mixed community, which all suggest an earlier date. Luke's setting may be in Antioch, Achaia in Greece, or in Rome.

John's Gospel is very different from the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. We will learn more about its contents in next month's Newsletter. Stay safe and keep well.

Prayer Topics for October

1. Leprosy Mission – India

Pray for God's guidance, wisdom and protection for all staff engaged in skills training and vocational education and also for the people affected by leprosy with whom they work. TLM India's vocational education programme is instrumental in enhancing the earning capacity of individuals affected with leprosy and general disabilities. Pray that the graduated become self reliant, take care of their families, cope with emergencies and lead a dignified life.

2. Mission Aviation Fellowship - Tanzania

Tanzania's population was left behind at the start of WHO's COVAX programme because many were suspicious about coronavirus vaccines. Pray that our Tanzania team is sensitive to the situation there and that the vaccination programme will roll out efficiently as the new President considers advice on how to take advantage of this free provision.

3. Open Doors – Ethiopia

Khalid's family disowned him when he chose to follow Jesus. After attending an Open Doors economic empowerment programme, he opened a shop and planted crops, but the area where he lives has been hit by Covid 19, locust swarms and political conflict. "I am discouraged" he says. "I want to plant grain on the rented land in the coming months." Pray for wisdom in moving his business forward.

4. At this Harvest time give thanks to God for the bounty of His creation. Remember those lands where crops have failed because of drought or floods, or where swarms of locusts have devoured everything. Pray that aid may be received through charities such as Christian Aid, Self Help Africa and others.

Pray for the people of La Palma who have lost everything because of the terrible volcanic eruption.

Ask God to call people to the ministry of His church so that many vacant charges be filled, more people encouraged to attend church and spread the Gospel in their communities.

As Heather leads the Sunday School, pray for her and the children that God will bless them and bring others to join them. Pray for parents to realise the importance of bringing their children to Sunday School and teaching them early to know and love the Lord Jesus.

Keep praying for healing and the Lord's encouragement for Wanda and His strengthening for Glenn at this difficult time for them.


