

January Newsletter for Girvan North.

Dear friends, Happy New Year! A Missionary advances God's Kingdom in another culture just as they have advanced God's Kingdom in their own culture.

What qualities do we need to be good Missionaries? Firstly, we need **certainty**. The certain belief that God wants us to follow Him into another culture. We have to be so certain that we can persuade others of our cause. Do we have certainty?

Secondly, we need initiative when making decisions without having to ask someone else about what should happen next. Do we have initiative?

Thirdly, we need **perseverance** in what we do. It is rare that everything works out perfectly from the start. Often we are only successful through having failed first. We must persist in our goals and it will finally pay off for us. Do we have perseverance?

Fourthly, we need **humility** in our actions. The focus is not on us but on the people we share the Good News with. Do we have humility? Fifthly, we need **flexibility** to believe that there are many ways to achieve our objectives, rather than just one way. People with greater flexibility can better achieve their goals compared to those who are completely inflexible. Do we have flexibility?

Sixthly, we need **enthusiasm** for what we do. If we are enthusiastic in what we do others will respond in a similarly enthusiastic manner. Do we have enthusiasm?

Seventhly, we need **life-long learning**. Every day should be a new learning experience. If we think we know everything we will quickly discover that there is a lot we do not know, and much more to learn. Do we have a thirst for life-long learning?

Eighthly, we need **resilience** and to be able to adapt to the new culture that we work in. We need emotional strength to recover from emotional trauma. Do we have resilience?

Ninthly, we need good **communication** skills to properly communicate our Good News message to others. Do we have good communication skills?

Tenthly, we need good **listening** skills. Being a good communicator is not enough if we are not good listeners. Do we have good listening skills?

These ten qualities of certainty, initiative, perseverance, humility, flexibility, enthusiasm, life-long learning, resilience, and effective communication and listening skills are the qualities that we would all need to possess if we were to become successful Missionaries. I would also argue that they are the qualities we would all need to possess if we were to become successful human beings. Jesus had all these qualities in abundance, but how many qualities do we possess? Maybe others should make that judgement. Very few people possess all of these qualities, but we are all "works in progress". We always strive for the ideal, despite never managing to achieve it, but that should never deter us from aiming for it in the first place. It is something Jesus expects from every one of us. So, let that be our mission. **Best wishes, Glenn.**

Treasurer's Report

Happy New Year to you all!

I am presently busy completing the 2022 Accounts. The accounts will then be presented to the Kirk Session for their approval and will also be checked by an independent examiner. The accounts are then sent to Presbytery, to the Church of Scotland in Edinburgh and to OSCR (Office of Scotlish Charity Regulator). Copies of the 2022 Accounts will be available to church members in due course.

In December our income was £5,634.75 and our expenditure £7,550.67. For the whole year our income was £75,137.92 and expenditure £75,550.67.

This position is mainly due to the following:-

- Our faithful members who continue to give generously and support all our fundraising events. I thank them most sincerely for that.
- The amount of tax I have been able to reclaim from the Inland Revenue from members who have signed up to Gift Aid. (£11,061)
- Expenditure kept in check but it concerns me that it is still more than our income. Three years ago the Kirk Session decided to only spend on essential repairs/ maintenance until the Church of Scotland had decided whether Girvan North or Girvan South Parish Church was to be retained after the Union of the churches. We now know that Girvan North is being retained so there will be increased maintenance costs in 2023.

Of our 470 members there are many who do not contribute anything to the work and upkeep of our church. I appeal to them at this time to support Girvan North in one of the following ways:-

- By using weekly Freewill Offering Envelopes
- By setting up a monthly bank standing order.
- By making a donation, either in cash or by cheque, payable to Girvan North Parish Church of Scotland.


3. Mission Aviation Fellowship - Kenya
