

Dear friends, Education is a wonderful way, at any age, of learning something new, deepening your knowledge in a subject already studied, making new friendships, embracing new technology, responding successfully to a challenge set for yourself, and having an enjoyable experience. I have chatted to many in the congregation who have spoken about education in this way. They spoke so positively about how they were treated by the institution they were studying with; how much support they received during their studies; and how much they gained from their educational experience. Education is a wonderful privilege which can benefit us all.

If we are honest, no one really likes change. It is easier just to do what we have always done. What is harder is to try something new, risk failure, and embark on a project where you do not know how it will end. Yes, it is harder, but it is also a challenge worth taking. If we always stay within our comfort zone we will begin to stop growing, and not aspire to do anything new; alternatively, if we move beyond our comfort zone, anything is possible. The reason why I have spent so much time talking about education is because I have decided to "return to University". I have decided to take a Masters Degree in Psychology, with the Open University, as I am studying a subject which will assist me in my Ministry at a very highly regarded institution. It will certainly be challenging, expensive, but essentially worthwhile.

This will begin in September, so I will try to organise my life to firstly, care for my wife, secondly, continue with my job as Locum, and thirdly, pursue my studies. It sounds good in theory; hopefully, it will all work out in practice!

Education is all very well, but experience should not be forgotten. Having a range of qualifications is not a lot if you have little empathy, common sense, or courage. Although Jesus' disciples were ordinary fishermen, they grew in experience as they "studied" Jesus. This study enabled them to spread the Christian message firstly across the Mediterranean, and then around the world. They did not need educational qualifications to do this; what they did need was courage, as well as common sense, and empathy. You can have all the qualifications in the world, but if you do not have courage, common sense, or empathy, you have very little to work with.

Despite being ordinary citizens, Jesus' disciples gained the experience needed to spread the Christian message. Understanding theory is important, but what is more important is applying that theory learned into practice. It is the practical application which should resolve any problems. Understanding someone's behaviour helps answer why they act in the way that they do. Everyone speculates, but Psychology rigorously applies these theories systematically. That is why, I believe, Psychology, like many other Social Sciences, greatly assists Ministry. Why do fewer people go to Church today? How can we encourage people to return to Church again? Why can some Churches better expand their congregations than others? What role does livestreaming play in encouraging people back to Church?

These answers will ultimately determine the future of the Church. As the disciples successfully expanded the Christian message firstly across the Mediterranean, and then around the world, the very least we can do is to ensure that their work was never completed in vain. **Best wishes, Glenn.**

The Elms, Edinburgh – Residential Care for older people with dementia


Daisy Chain Early Years project – Play based groups and family support to help families thrive together


